Please join us at the Varnum Armory on Saturday evening, November 18!

The Varnum Armory was built in 1913 in the medieval architectural style. The armory is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and it is in perfect original condition.

For military buffs, the collection includes:

- Military weapons & artifacts from the 16th century to the present
- Collection of more than 600 original WWI & WWII posters
- Official museum collection of the 76th Infantry Division
- Colt Model 1883 Gatling Gun and Limber and several artillery pieces
- Militia commissions and appointments dating from the 17th century, including documents signed by George Washington
- RI Train of Artillery leather helmet worn by Capt/Lt. Benijah Carpenter when he was killed at the Battle of Long Island August 27, 1776
- Collections of medals, ribbons and toy soldiers
- Hundreds of vintage photos and other artifacts

DIRECTIONS

From Providence and points north:

Take I-95 South to Exit 9 (left exit) toward East Greenwich/North Kingstown. You will immediately merge onto RI Route 4 South. Take the first exit (number 8) which is marked Route 401 toward East Greenwich. Turn right at the light at the top of the ramp. You are now on Division Street. Bear LEFT when the road forks, and continue to the traffic light at Division and Main. The Varnum Armory is on the far right corner. Continue across Main Street and you will find ample free parking in the lot on the right behind the armory.

From Westerly and points south:

Take I-95 North toward Providence. Take exit 8A (RI Route 2 South) toward RI Route 4/East Greenwich. Merge onto RI Route 2 for 0.17 miles, then turn left onto Route 401/Division Street. Continue as above to Main Street.

From Newport:

Take Route 138 across the Newport and Jamestown Bridges. Turn right onto Route 1 (Tower Hill Road) north toward Providence. After 3/4 of a mile Route 1 merges into Route 4 north; bear left. Take exit 8A toward East Greenwich, then turn onto Route 401/Division Street. Continue as above to Main Street.
